LAKESIDE PARK & PIER

ST. CATHARINES

Lakeside Park and Pier in Port Dalhousie is one of Niagara's most iconic places to visit. Take a ride on the carousel for just a nickel, relax on the beach, visit the variety of shops and restaurants nearby, or take a walk down the park's bustling pier.

TASKS

2. Out of all the boats at the yacht club, which one had your favourite name?



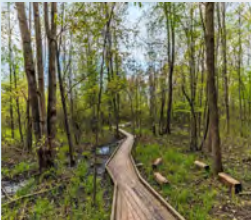
CHARLES DALEY PARK

ST. CATHARINES

Besides already being a great place to visit in the spring, summer, and fall, Charles Daley Park in Lincoln can also be enjoyed during the winter thanks to its excellent toboggan hills. There are two designated sledding areas to cruise down, and, of course, the rest of the park is open as well.

TASKS

1. Get a picture (or video) of you and your group sledding.
2. Take a picture of you and your group in the bandshell



HEARTLAND FOREST

NIAGARA FALLS

Heartland Forest features 4 kilometers of accessible hiking trails "through grasslands, wetlands and the largest stand of Carolinian Forest in the Niagara Peninsula," as well as boardwalks, picnic pavilions, a large treehouse, a nature centre, turtle, frog, and fish ponds, and mini-putt.

TASKS

1. Get a picture of one of the many birdhouses found throughout the forest.
2. Take a picture of you and your group at the entrance to the forest or the trail map.



BEAMER FALLS

GRIMSBY

Want to witness an unforgettable view of the city of Grimsby and the rest of the Niagara region? Then Beamer Falls is the place to visit. The conservation area includes easy-to-navigate trails, viewing towers, and is the home of the Niagara Peninsula Hawkwatch.

TASKS

1. Take a photo with one of Beamer Falls' views of the Niagara region from an overlook.
2. Take a group photo on top of one of the park's observation structures.



MORNINGSTAR MILL

ST. CATHARINES

The Morningstar Mill is a heritage site located at Decew Falls in St. Catharines. There, you'll find a working grist mill that was built in 1872, a turbine shed, and the Morningstar family's historic home. The surrounding park is also a great spot for picnicking and hiking.

TASKS

1. Take a group photo with the mill
2. Safely take a photo of Decew Falls



HAPPY ROLPH'S ANIMAL FARM

ST. CATHARINES

Happy Rolph's Animal Farm is home to farm animals, beautiful walking trails, a great view of Lake Ontario, a large playground, a picnic area, and a famous collection of rhododendrons.

TASKS

1. Each member of the group takes a picture with one of the animals and give each animal a name.
2. Take a group photo with Happy Rolph's famous rhododendrons.



WELLAND CANAL

ST. CATHARINES / THOROLD / PORT COLBORNE

Watch enormous ships come and go along the famous Welland Canal at either the Lock 3, Lock 7, or Lock 8 observation areas.

TASKS

1. Take a photo with a ship that has docked at the Canal
2. Visit Locks 3, 7, or 8 (only one is necessary) and take a picture with...
 - A. The anchor at Lock 3.
 - B. The kissing stone or polar bear at Lock 7
 - C. The fountain at Lock 8



QUEEN'S ROYAL PARK / MEMORIAL

CLOCK TOWER

NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE

The Memorial Clock Tower is a fixture of downtown Niagara-on-the-Lake, and was built to commemorate the lives of Niagara citizens lost in WWI. Queen's Royal Park offers up stunning views of Fort Niagara and Lake Ontario that can be seen from the park's well-known gazebo.

TASKS

1. Take a group photo in front of the clock tower
2. Take a photo inside the gazebo at Queen's Royal Park



WAINFLEET BOG

WAINFLEET

The Wainfleet Bog is a conservation area that is part of the only bog wetland in the Niagara Peninsula and is home to a variety of plants and animals. Boardwalks and trails are available for anyone who wants to see and experience this unique destination.

TASK

1. Take a photo with the trail map.



THE FRIENDSHIP TRAIL

FORT ERIE

The Friendship Trail is a 16 kilometer path that begins at the western border of Port Colborne and leads all the way to Old Fort Erie and Lake Erie. The trail is located upon an abandoned rail line, and the paths are smooth and level and perfect for walking and cycling in the spring and summer and traversed frequently by cross-country skiers in the winter.

TASK

1. Take 2 photos of you and your group: one where you begin walking and one where you decide to stop.



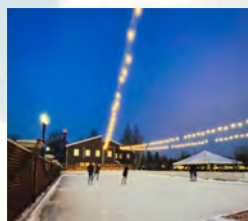
QUEENSTON HEIGHTS

QUEENSTON

Whether you're a hiker, a Canadian history buff, or just looking for a nice spot to enjoy a family picnic, Queenston Heights may be the place for you. It's located atop the Niagara Escarpment, is the home of the iconic Brock Monument and is the terminus of the Bruce Trail.

TASKS

1. Bring a picnic lunch and take a photo of your group enjoying it.
2. Take a photo with the Brock Monument



ICE SKATING AT PILLAR & POST

NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE

Enjoy some time on the ice rink at The Pillar and Post Inn & Spa in Niagara-on-the-Lake, which is free to use for both hotel guests and the general public. Skates are available for rent for \$5.00 a pair, though guests are strongly encouraged to bring their own pairs if possible.

TASK

1. Take a photo of you and your group skating.



ST. JOHN'S CONSERVATION AREA

FONTHILL

The St. John's Conservation Area is located within the Niagara Escarpment and the Twenty Mile Creek valley. It features four walking trails and is a popular destination for fishing enthusiasts and bird watchers.

TASK

1. Take a photo of a unique plant or animal you find at the park



NIAGARA PARKWAY

NIAGARA FALLS

The Niagara Parkway is one of Ontario's most scenic drives that runs parallel to Niagara Falls. It also passes by some of the city's other famous attractions.

TASK

1. Take a photo of you and your group with The Falls.
